
Worshipping God, Growing in Faith, Serving the community

A message from Reverend Rebecca:

Many of you will be aware that I have been suffering from the effects of Long Covid for over a year. Whilst I have never sought to do anything other than fulfil my duties, the impact of the condition has taken its toll. Following pastoral conversations with both the Bishop of Burnley and the Archdeacon of Lancaster, it has been agreed that it is wise for me to have a period of extended leave over 6 weeks this summer. I need the space and time to try to recover more fully so that I can return to better health. I am grateful for your understanding, support, and prayer as I am that of the diocesan leadership. Throughout the summer the Area Dean and Archdeacon will be available to offer support as will the Churchwardens (Jayne and Tony), Rev Claire Cooke, the St Paul's Ministry Team and Rev Gary Bowness (an active retired clergy person in Lancaster).

Please pray for myself and the family over the coming weeks as I shall pray for you.

Changes to Government Guidance from 19th July and what this means for our Church:

We will be revising our Covid Guidance and Policy this week after we receive further information from the Church of England.

However, after this Sunday there will no longer be a need to book a place to attend a service; however we will still take your details on arrival for 'track and trace' purposes. We will still be recommending the wearing of masks and socially distancing due to the local infection rates and you will be escorted to your seat as at present. At St Paul's, Hala, we will be reading through Luke chapter 6 over summer to learn how we build our lives on Jesus, the solid foundation. Readings will be available at the service.

A message from Rev Claire:

At PCC last week, we were visited by +Jill who shared about why she would like to invest into growing the church here in St Paul's Scotforth, particularly in the Hala area, by using a large proportion of her budget to cover a half-time stipend which would enable me to work part time alongside Rev Rebecca, taking responsibility for this part of the parish.

It seems as though God has been at work in the unseen places for a while now. +Jill recounted various instances where Rev Rebecca, +Jill and I had each been separately praying for Hala and sensing that God might want to grow the church here in new ways. As the dots began to connect, we realised we had a similar vision for what could grow on Hala.

What followed those conversations was my being offered and accepting the role of 'interim ordained pioneer minister' here in Hala, in January. Since that time, I have watched, listened, read and learned about the call of God from St Paul's, Scotforth to plant a new local congregation for those living on the Hala estate, when it was first built in 1984.

I have been thrilled to learn that St Paul's, Hala, has been a place of lively worship, inclusivity for children and young people, hospitality

and creativity in the ways in which it seeks to be a relaxed place where local people can gather around Jesus. +Jill spoke of future growth for a new generation as the baton of mission in Hala that has been so faithfully carried by so many for so long, may now be passed on to a new generation,



entrusting it to those who will take this same core identity, calling and purpose of the church in Hala and reimagine it for a new generation of people living in Hala. Incredibly, St James', lower Darwin (who I recently discovered we were twinned with several years ago) have moved through a similar transition and are once again, on a similar faith journey to see the church renewed in the local estate. The relationship between us has been 'accidentally' rekindled, as I regularly meet with Sharon, my St James' counterpart, for prayer, encouragement and sharing of ideas. Another recognisable move of God, I think.

There are several ways in which I would love to prayerfully pick up the baton of lively worship, encouraging young leaders, hospitality and being creative to bring the gospel of Jesus as we love and serve the people living in Hala and would love to share those ideas in time. I have already begun exploring the potential of starting a food club hub in Hala, as well as a football club for young people which uses the language of football to teach young people about following Jesus. In all that we do, we must hold in mind that our specific call as the church is to introduce people to Jesus. As we serve people in their need, we must also be learning to speak about Jesus in different ways, so different people can hear about him in a language they understand. I am excited about this because as we follow Jesus' lead in this way, we too grow in faith and trust in him.

I am thrilled that the PCC agreed with great faith and enthusiasm to accept +Jill's offer and to take the next steps in making my post more permanent.

The hope of Rev Rebecca and I, is that as we continue to be the St Paul's Family across two locations; that we all will flourish in faith, hope and life in Jesus Christ. There will be much for us to explore together. This really is just the beginning of a new chapter in the story of St Paul's, Hala, but I am excited to be here to lead into what God has for this community next.

It was wonderful to be able to welcome Ramesh back at St Paul's and to see him, after so many years, with his family who are now with him when they visited Lancaster last weekend. We wish them well for their futures together.

Recollections of the SLCT Prayer Walk by Christine Medd:

We met last Friday in the garden of Trinity URC – a group ranging in ages from mid-fifties to late eighties; some coping with hip or back problems, at least two recovering from recent operations, one with a stick; but all ready to walk, pray and enjoy themselves! Our first prayer stop was in St Martin's Chapel in the grounds of the University of Cumbria, where Arton told us some of its history and we learnt that it is now an ecumenical and interfaith chapel. We wandered around, looking at the various plaques, tiles and paintings before leaving to walk past the Archbishop Sentamu building.

The weather was fine but somewhat cloudy and overcast, but as we walked onto the high path above the playing fields and courts, we had to stop and look at the breathtaking scene out over the city and towards the Lake District hills, as the sky was reflected in the water. One lady has written, 'The view over the Bay with the orange light will be with me for a long time. God is good at creating highlights.' Another person asked, 'Is this God's intervention?'

Our walk continued with prayer stops by the Sports Clinic, the main gates to Williamson Park and then to Christ Church where we saw a poster outside telling us that the church was open today, and then were met inside (by arrangement) by the Vicar, Carol Backhouse. She gave us an interesting and lively talk about the building; the way it was used as the chapel for those in the workhouse, who had to enter by a different door from the other parishioners (the door is in what is now the vestry); and the continuing support for the homeless who are now welcomed to the winter night shelter. After a prayer, we were able to wander as we wished around the church before voicing our thanks to Carol and leaving to walk to Scotch Quarry.


This is a lovely green oasis in the midst of a built-up area, with a community garden growing food for local people, a children's play area and a cycle/pedestrian path. A special moment here was listening to a bird singing during the prayer!

Further along our prayer walk, we stopped at Westham Street to remember the redundant Methodist Mission church which has been converted into flats, then through the University grounds to the Gateway building, with prayers of thanks for the past, and hopes for the future of, the University. We finally arrived back at Trinity URC, where we formed a large circle in the car park to joyously sing the hymn, 'To God be the glory'.

We then went into the quiet, peaceful, beautiful URC chapel. Having only recently been re-opened after renovation, it was a surprise which was greeted with what was perhaps an awesome silence. All the work was explained to us - insulated walls, stunning new windows, sensitive lighting, heating system and so on. It was a wonderful ending to our prayer walk, as the church itself seemed to echo and draw together all our prayers – that God is good, to him be the glory!

Thank you to all from St Paul's who took part in the walk and especially to those who led the prayers.
