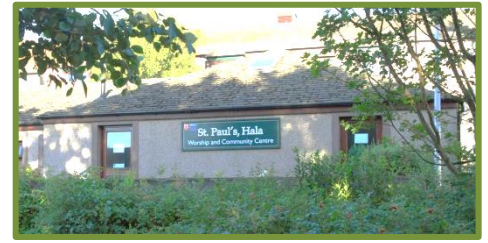

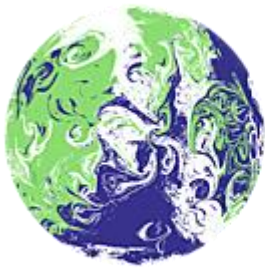

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ITALY

As the world leaders meet for COP26 in Glasgow this week to make agreements about working towards tackling climate change, the Queen sent a message to them, which included the following words:

None of us underestimates the challenges ahead: but history has shown that when nations come together in common cause, there is always room for hope. Working side by side, we have the ability to solve the most insurmountable problems and to triumph over the greatest of adversities.

There is always room for hope. This is something our faith in Jesus has taught us. Even in death, the hope of the resurrection remains. This gives us a forward lean, looking towards the full and final coming of the Kingdom of God. Jesus is king and we also wait and work towards the coming of his kingdom. This is why we pray 'your kingdom come, your will be done'.

But hope is ushered in with action. We have real hope in Jesus, not because of what we do, but because of the action of God in Jesus' life, death and resurrection and by being filled with His Holy Spirit.

Hope for our world is also ushered in by action: The actions of our governments and our own actions. Without action, hope dies. So let us pray for our world leaders, that they may be filled with hope as they meet this week and that promises made do indeed turn into action. Let us pray for ourselves and ask God to show us what next small change we can each make to expand hope for our planet.

As we act, let us also look to our creator God of hope to give us life, direction and strength to keep going in bringing the long lasting changes we need.

Ruth 3.1-5, 4.13-17

^{3.1} Naomi her mother-in-law said to her, 'My daughter, I need to seek some security for you, so that it may be well with you. ² Now here is our kinsman Boaz, with whose young women you have been working. See, he is winnowing barley tonight at the threshing floor. ³ Now wash and anoint yourself, and put on your best clothes and go down to the threshing-floor; but do not make yourself known to the man until he has finished eating and drinking. ⁴ When he lies down, observe the place where he lies; then, go and uncover his feet and lie down; and he will tell you what to do. ⁵ She said to her, 'All that you tell me I will do.

^{4.13} So Boaz took Ruth and she became his wife. When they came together, the Lord made her conceive, and she bore a son. ¹⁴ The the women said to Naomi, 'Blessed be the Lord, who has not left you this day without next-of-kin; and may his name be renowned in Israel! ¹⁵ He shall be to you a restorer of life and a nourisher of your old age; for your daughter-in-law who loves you, who is more to you than seven sons, has borne him.' ¹⁶ The Naomi took the child and laid him in her bosom, and became his nurse. ¹⁷ The women of the neighbourhood gave him a name, saying, 'A son has been born to Naomi.' They named him Obed; he became the father of Jesse, the father of David.

Mark 12.38-44

³⁸ As he taught, he said, 'Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the market-places, ³⁹ and to have the best seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at the banquets! ⁴⁰ They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation.' ⁴¹ He said down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. ⁴² A poor widow came and put in two

small copper coins, which are worth a penny. ⁴³ Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. ⁴⁴ For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.'

Christ Church, Lancaster are looking for a Deputy Night Shelter Co-ordinator. You will work with our existing two Co-ordinators and team of over forty volunteers to ensure that the Winter Shelter runs safely and smoothly, offering a warm, supportive and encouraging welcome to our guests. We seek an experienced, mature person who can communicate clearly and effectively, and handle difficult situations well.

Permanent, seasonal contract, working 1st October-31st March each year, with 2 weeks' break over Christmas. Minimum 2 nights per week, plus additional time for meetings, preparation and outreach - approximately 50 working hours per month. £500 per month of the season. Subject to Enhanced DBS clearance, and references. Further training will be available.

Christ Church has been running the Shelter for nearly 30 years, and it is the only non-referral Shelter in the North West. It is an expression of the Church's care following Jesus' teaching. We make no faith expectation of guests, and ask that staff and volunteers respect Christ Church's values.

Service Provision (8am & 9.45am) and Health and Safety:

- the church building will be sanitised before the start of each service;
- we have two seating options – the central aisles and side aisle (organ side) there is ‘open seating’ – please do sit anywhere you feel comfortable. The side aisle (as you come in by the font) is laid out so that you can choose to be socially distanced.
- You will be asked to use hand sanitiser on entering church.
- We encourage everyone to wear a mask whilst attending a service.
- You can pick up service materials on the way into the building from the table at the door; we ask that you return these to the table at the back on your way out.
- Our one-way system of movement around the church is still in place both for going up to take communion and entering and exiting the building. Please follow the direction of the steward or warden present. We will sign green cards at the back of church on the way out – please remember to get your card signed even if your child isn’t present attendance is based on parent and/or child.

However Traidcraft is very much in existence and orders can be made by phone on **0191 491 0855** or online at www.traidcraftshop.co.uk I have one or two catalogues that you can peruse, and they cover a wide range of goods from Christmas cards to food, drink, clothing and homewares.

Traidcraft tackles injustice from the bottom up. It champions farmers who savour the soil and nurture nature. Traidcraft applauds suppliers who cut emissions, reduce their waste and are resourceful in their energy use, and it celebrates supply chains that match and go beyond Fairtrade standards allowing farmers, producers and artisans and their families to not just survive, but to thrive.

Remember each time you spend it is a vote for the world you would like to see. If something seems too cheap someone down the supply chain is paying the price.

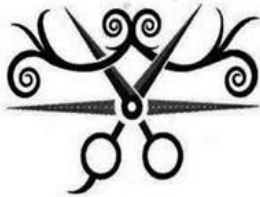

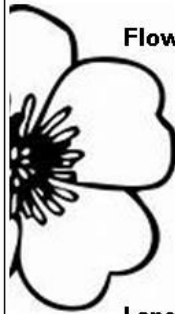
