Message from Reverend Rebecca:

Confirmation 2022

After many years St Paul's will be celebrating a Confirmation service on 13th July at 7pm with Bishop Julian, the Bishop of Blackburn.

What is Confirmation?

Confirmation is when a person confirms the promises that were made when they were baptised in a special service. If you were baptised as a child, your parents and godparents made these promises on your behalf. As a young person or adult, you may be ready to affirm these promises for yourself and commit your life to following Jesus Christ. Your friends and family as well as the local Christian community will be there to promise to support and pray for you. If you were not baptised as a child and want to make a commitment of faith, please speak to me. During the Confirmation service Bishop Julian will lay their hands on your head and ask God's Holy Spirit to give you the strength and commitment to live God's way for the rest of your life.

There is no right age for a person to be confirmed. Anyone may be confirmed who has been baptised and if they are old enough to answer responsibly for themselves. Anyone in Year 5 and above who feels ready to confirm their faith is welcome.

Over 5 confirmation classes we'll learn and talk about our faith together (and have some fun and snacks). We are looking at either Thursdays from 4:30-5:30pm or Sunday early evenings.

Adults

As an adult, your experience of the church may be fairly limited or you may have been coming to church for several years. As far as confirmation is concerned, perhaps you have thought about it in the past, or it may be something you are considering for the first time.

The decision to be confirmed is an important one in anyone's life. At confirmation, we take the promises made for us at baptism and make them for ourselves, not privately but in the presence of the bishop who represents the wider church.

Preparation will involve getting together in person to discuss what Confirmation is all about and giving you the opportunity to ask the questions you've always wondered about. Dates and times to be discussed.



Preparation for confirmation will be relaxed and informal and *no previous knowledge of the bible, church history or anything like that is required or assumed!*

Taking part in preparation places you under no obligation to be confirmed if, at the end, you feel that this isn't the right step or the right time for you.

Readings for 1st May 2022:

Acts 9.1-6

9Meanwhile Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest ²and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. ³Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. ⁴He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' ⁵He asked, 'Who are you, Lord?' The reply came, 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. ⁶But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do.'

John 21.1-19

21After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. ²Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin,* Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. ³Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

⁴ Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him, 'No.' ⁶He said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. ⁷That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. ⁸But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards* off.

⁹ When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. ¹⁰Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' ¹¹So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. ¹²Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. ¹³Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. ¹⁴This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

¹⁵ When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' ¹⁶A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' ¹⁷He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep. ¹⁸Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' ¹⁹(He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

We discussed our financial situation after a review of 2021 and how we need to review our outgoings and carry out a Planned Giving campaign. Work on both of these areas will start very soon.


**St Paul's Hala Pantry require a part-time Manager (4 hrs per week)
