### Readings for 26<sup>th</sup> March 2023:

#### Psalm 130

- 1 Out of the depths have I cried to you, O Lord;  
Lord, hear my voice; •  
let your ears consider well the voice of my supplication.
- 2 If you, Lord, were to mark what is done amiss, •  
O Lord, who could stand?
- 3 But there is forgiveness with you, •  
so that you shall be feared.
- 4 I wait for the Lord; my soul waits for him; •

in his word is my hope.

5 My soul waits for the Lord,  
more than the night watch for the morning, •  
more than the night watch for the morning.

6 O Israel, wait for the Lord, •  
for with the Lord there is mercy;

7 With him is plenteous redemption •  
and he shall redeem Israel from all their sins.

### **John 11.1-45**

11 Now a certain man was ill, Lazarus of Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. <sup>2</sup>Mary was the one who anointed the Lord with perfume and wiped his feet with her hair; her brother Lazarus was ill. <sup>3</sup>So the sisters sent a message to Jesus, 'Lord, he whom you love is ill.' <sup>4</sup>But when Jesus heard it, he said, 'This illness does not lead to death; rather it is for God's glory, so that the Son of God may be glorified through it.' <sup>5</sup>Accordingly, though Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, <sup>6</sup>after having heard that Lazarus was ill, he stayed two days longer in the place where he was.

<sup>7</sup>Then after this he said to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judea again.' <sup>8</sup>The disciples said to him, 'Rabbi, the Jews were just now trying to stone you, and are you going there again?' <sup>9</sup>Jesus answered, 'Are there not twelve hours of daylight? Those who walk during the day do not stumble, because they see the light of this world. <sup>10</sup>But those who walk at night stumble, because the light is not in them.' <sup>11</sup>After saying this, he told them, 'Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep, but I am going there to awaken him.' <sup>12</sup>The disciples said to him, 'Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will be all right.' <sup>13</sup>Jesus, however, had been speaking about his death, but they thought that he was referring merely to sleep. <sup>14</sup>Then Jesus told them plainly, 'Lazarus is dead. <sup>15</sup>For your sake I am glad I was not there, so that you may believe. But let us go to him.' <sup>16</sup>Thomas, who was called the Twin, said to his fellow-disciples, 'Let us also go, that we may die with him.'

<sup>17</sup>When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. <sup>18</sup>Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, some two miles away, <sup>19</sup>and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to console them about their brother. <sup>20</sup>When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met him, while Mary stayed at home. <sup>21</sup>Martha said to Jesus, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. <sup>22</sup>But even now I know that God will give you whatever you ask of him.' <sup>23</sup>Jesus said to her, 'Your brother will rise again.' <sup>24</sup>Martha said to him, 'I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day.' <sup>25</sup>Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, <sup>26</sup>and everyone who lives

and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' <sup>27</sup>She said to him, 'Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world.'

<sup>28</sup> When she had said this, she went back and called her sister Mary, and told her privately, 'The Teacher is here and is calling for you.' <sup>29</sup>And when she heard it, she got up quickly and went to him. <sup>30</sup>Now Jesus had not yet come to the village, but was still at the place where Martha had met him. <sup>31</sup>The Jews who were with her in the house, consoling her, saw Mary get up quickly and go out. They followed her because they thought that she was going to the tomb to weep there. <sup>32</sup>When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.' <sup>33</sup>When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. <sup>34</sup>He said, 'Where have you laid him?' They said to him, 'Lord, come and see.' <sup>35</sup>Jesus began to weep. <sup>36</sup>So the Jews said, 'See how he loved him!' <sup>37</sup>But some of them said, 'Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?'

<sup>38</sup> Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. <sup>39</sup>Jesus said, 'Take away the stone.' Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, 'Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead for four days.' <sup>40</sup>Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?' <sup>41</sup>So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upwards and said, 'Father, I thank you for having heard me. <sup>42</sup>I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me.' <sup>43</sup>When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out!' <sup>44</sup>The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, and let him go.'

<sup>45</sup> Many of the Jews therefore, who had come with Mary and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him.

### **Post Communion Prayer for 26th March 2023:**

Lord Jesus Christ,  
you have taught us  
that what we do for the least of our brothers and sisters  
we do also for you:  
give us the will to be the servant of others  
as you were the servant of all,  
and gave up your life and died for us,  
but are alive and reign, now and for ever.

All the envelopes containing banker's orders or gift aid declarations are sent to the treasurer, unopened. Apart from the treasurer, the auditor and the inland revenue, no-one else knows how much any individual regularly gives to the Church.

## ANNUAL CHURCH MEETING:

The **Annual meeting (APCM)** is a major event in the parish calendar. This year we are going to incorporate our Annual Meeting within our 9.45am service on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> April at St Paul's Church, there will be no service at St Paul's Hala on this morning. Copies of the Annual Report and accounts will be available on the website, and are attached to the parish news weekly email and available from the back of church.



The Annual meeting elects Churchwardens for the coming year. We also **elect the Church Council and, this year, Deanery Synod members.** On the Church Council we have four vacancies for a 3-year period, two for a 2-year period and one for a 1-year period so if you are interested about the work of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and only want to give it a trial then maybe the 1-year period would be of interest to you. On Deanery Synod there are three vacancies each of which is for a 3-year period.

Please note that you have to be registered on the Electoral Roll for at least six months prior to the AGM to be eligible for election. If you are unsure whether you are on the Roll or would like to go on the Roll then please talk to Jayne, Churchwarden. If you would like to learn about being a member of the Church Council or Deanery Synod then please talk to either Rev Rebecca, Jayne or pick up a nomination form from the back of church.


### Daily readings during Lent:

Many of you will have been reading the booklet given away at the back of church called, 'That you may know the truth'. We have looked at sections from the Gospel of Luke during Lent and a comment from a different Christian each day. We are now half way through.

So, how has it been for you?

Last week in the Parish News I was encouraging you to chat with someone else about what you have been reading. This week I want to think a bit about what we have been reading of Jesus – and encourage you to pray.

We have now reached the part of the Gospel where Jesus' ministry has become well known. He has become famous and word has got out that there is a celebrity around. We have read of thousands gathering to hear him preach and heal the sick. Expectations are rising about what Jesus is going to do next – and then we



are shocked and startled to read some difficult passages and critical words from him as the teacher.

If you are reading alone and want to ask for help understanding some of the difficult passages and sayings of Jesus, do ask. None of us have all the answers but, as I wrote last week, there are plenty of people around to encourage you in your walk with Jesus. We are all wrestling with some big questions.

And then we can pray! We have been reading in the Lent course about prayer, so let's encourage one another to pray. We can pray as Jesus taught us in what we now call the Lord's Prayer. We can also use the Collects of the church provided for each Sunday. Here is the one for Bible Sunday which I hope helps you pray with the course. Blessed Lord,

who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: help us so to hear them,

to read, mark, learn and inwardly digest them that, through patience, and the comfort of your holy word, we may embrace and for ever hold fast the hope of everlasting life,

which you have given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

one God, now and for ever. Amen




