Collect for 23rd April 2023:

Risen Christ, you filled your disciples with boldness and fresh hope: strengthen us to proclaim your risen life and fill us with your peace, to the glory of God the Father.

Readings for 23rd April 2023:

Acts 2.14a, 36-41

¹⁴ But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say.

³⁶Therefore let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified.'
³⁷ Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, 'Brothers, what should we do?' ³⁸Peter said to them, 'Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
³⁹For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him.' ⁴⁰And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, 'Save yourselves from this

corrupt generation.' ⁴¹So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added.

Luke 24.13-35

¹³ Now on that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, ¹⁴and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. ¹⁵While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, ¹⁶but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. ¹⁷And he said to them, 'What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?' They stood still, looking sad.¹⁸Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, 'Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?' ¹⁹He asked them, 'What things?' They replied, 'The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, ²⁰and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. ²¹But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. ²²Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, ²³and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. ²⁴Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him.' ²⁵Then he said to them, 'Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! ²⁶Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?' ²⁷Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures.

²⁸ As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. ²⁹But they urged him strongly, saying, 'Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over.' So he went in to stay with them. ³⁰When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. ³¹Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. ³²They said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?' ³³That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. ³⁴They were saying, 'The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!' ³⁵Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

Post Communion Prayer for 23rd April 2023:

Living God, your Son made himself known to his disciples in the breaking of bread: open the eyes of our faith, that we may see him in all his redeeming work; who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.

All the envelopes containing banker's orders or gift aid declarations are sent to the treasurer, unopened. Apart from the treasurer, the auditor and the inland revenue, no-one else knows how much any individual regularly gives to the Church. Alternatively - if you would like

Parish Postcard Delivery

Thank you to everyone who took some postcards for delivery within the parish. Ours arrived before 12 noon on Sunday however there are many more still to go out. One volunteer offered to do her street, but unfortunately it was outside our boundary, so she took another one instead.

So how big is St Paul's parish? It's about 4 miles east to west and 3 miles north to south but the church is nowhere near the middle. You can go towards Quernmore down the zig-zag hill to Conder Mill, which is in the parish, but Greaves Park is not. Within the city the boundary has been shifted now and then, but has stayed the same in rural areas for many years. So from Conder Mill the boundary follows the River Conder southwards to near Lancaster University, then across its land, through Lancaster House Hotel car park, over the A6, and after a small dip south to Canal bridge No. 89, follows a straight line north west, crossing Lancaster Golf Club's course, to the River Lune which it follows northwards. It comes back inland through Aldcliffe to the canal. From here onwards the boundary passes south of Haverbreaks, up Ashton Road then under the bridge on Bridge Road and left to follow Binyon and Brunton Roads to the A6. Next it goes up the side of Greaves Park, over the hill to Avondale Road and right at Bowerham Post Office following the middle of the road to the bridge over Burrow Beck, which itself becomes the boundary up to the north side of the Leisure Park. The last bit is across fields and the M6 to join the River Conder half a mile upstream from where we began.

If you would like to deliver postcards, even to the outlying parts, just collect some extras from church!
