### **Message from Reverend Rebecca:**

This Sunday is Father's Day, for Father's Day, when we honour our fathers and celebrate fatherhood.

In the bible there are many different names used to describe God. While all the names of God are important in many ways, the name "Abba Father" is one of the most important because it helps us in understanding how God relates to people. The word 'Abba' is an Aramaic word that means 'Father.' It was a common term that expressed affection, confidence, and trust. The' most well-known prayer within the Christian tradition is The Lord's Prayer, one that Jesus taught his followers, which begins with the words Our Father'. That opening line reminds us of the awesomeness of God who we believe is the creator of heaven and earth.

Most Christians know the Lord's Prayer by heart in their own language, and it is used today by every Christian tradition (though perhaps with variations in the wording). It has a place in all our church services including, funerals, baptisms, and weddings, and forms a pattern of prayer for Christians.

Some people find Father's Day a day to celebrate, while for others it brings up a sense of pain and sadness. Christians believe that God is with us through the tough times as well as the good times, and that our Abba Father loves us and wants to live a life in all its fullness. I pray that this June you will have an opportunity to celebrate and enjoy those who have nurtured and loved you; but I recognise this might not be easy. I hope that you will be able to pray in the name of our Heavenly Father and to receive His peace.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

Faithful Creator, whose mercy never fails: deepen our faithfulness to you and to your living Word, Jesus Christ our Lord.

# **Readings for Sunday 18th June:** Romans 5.1-8

5 Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>2</sup>through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. <sup>3</sup>And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, <sup>4</sup>and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, <sup>5</sup>and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. <sup>6</sup> For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. <sup>7</sup>Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. <sup>8</sup>But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

#### Matthew 9.35-10.8

<sup>35</sup> Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. <sup>36</sup>When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. <sup>37</sup>Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; <sup>38</sup>therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.'

10Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. <sup>2</sup>These are the names of the twelve

apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; <sup>3</sup>Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax-collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; <sup>4</sup>Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

<sup>5</sup> These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: 'Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, <sup>6</sup>but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. <sup>7</sup>As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near." <sup>8</sup>Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

As I did not get to church on Sunday, I decided to go to Evensong at the Priory. It turned out to conclude with Benediction, a low key commemoration of the feast of Corpus Christi which Revd Rebecca had told us about last Thursday. Led by the Dean of Lancaster, who preached a commendably brief sermon very similar in content to Revd Rebecca's, and blessed the sacrament on the altar with incense. This would have choked us all in St Pauls but was pleasant in the wide airy space of the Priory. The choir, mostly girls and women, sang an anthem by Byrd, the Catholic composer who amazingly had kept his faith, his job and his head through periods of great religious turmoil in England, reminded us that not all our religious mysteries can be understood in simple language. Two members of the congregation read the lessons and we sang some splendid hymns. I greatly enjoyed the service which was conducted with dignity and grace. Thanks to all who participated.

#### St Barnabas, Christian Aid and Ukraine Flooding:

In her sermon on Sunday Rev Rebecca cited St Barnabas as one who encouraged the disciples in Antioch in their faith. He and St Paul taught them for a whole year and it was there that the disciples of Jesus were first called Christians. The teaching must have included Christian responsibility to the poor and needy as, when the disciples heard of a famine in Judea, they sent relief, each according to their ability, to those in need (Acts 11. 27-30). Perhaps we could claim St Barnabas as the first Christian Aid organiser!

Following the blowing up of the Nova Kakhovka dam in Ukraine, thousands of people have been forced to leave their homes. Christian Aid through Heritage Ukraine got to work immediately by supplying food, water and shelter, and in the coming days they and CA's other partners Alliance for Public Health and World Jewish Relief, will be providing humanitarian supplies to people who have had to leave the affected areas of southern Ukraine. Margaret is selling copies for much needed church funds, but the underlying reason for writing it is that she would like us all to think of ourselves as 'God's Orchard' - where we bear more fruit.

The Fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness (Margaret uses the word fidelity), gentleness and self-control. Margaret suggests that the fruit (singular) all stems from the first in the list, 'love' which she expands in separate chapters.

Why do I commend this book? Well, yes, it is fund raising, but also

because Margaret enlightens our understanding of each aspect of the fruit, and inspires us to be more fruitful in our daily lives. There are lovely little stories beautifully told from her own experience (I'll leave you to read about her trying to open a tin of prunes!) which connect with scripture, and each section can be read as a daily devotional.

Originally written as a Lent course and put together for printing as a lock-down project, Margaret still has copies available and it would be good for us all to buy, read, and be more 'fruitful'.


