A Messy Church Installation by Sundiya Jeremiah:

On Saturday Amali and I (and our parents) went to Blackburn Cathedral for Bishop Philip's 'installation' as the new Bishop of Blackburn. He was the Bishop of Burnley and was 'installed' on the 'Cathedra' (bishop's chair) in the Cathedral. The kids went down to the crypt for a fun messy church. We decorated our own bishops' mitres (the pointy hats bishops wear) and acted out when Mary went to see her cousin Elizabeth. We also made Bishop Philip a special cloak out of prayers and pictures that he wore down the aisle when

we all processed back into church wearing our mitres.

It was an interesting experience. After the service I spoke with Sir Lindsay Hoyle, the Speaker of the House of Commons. I told him all about what Year Six at Scotforth St Paul's school learnt about Parliament. He was very kind and really interested in what I was learning.



Bishop Philip then came down to the crypt and told us to be loud in our churches.

Readings for Sunday2nd July:

Romans 6.12-end

¹² Therefore, do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. ¹³No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. ¹⁴For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

¹⁵ What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! ¹⁶Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, ¹⁸and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. ¹⁹I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification.

²⁰ When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. ²¹So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. ²²But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. ²³For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Matthew 10.40-end

40 'Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. 41Whoever welcomes a prophet in the name of a prophet will receive a prophet's reward; and whoever welcomes a righteous person in the name of a righteous person will receive the reward of the righteous; 42and whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple—truly I tell you, none of these will lose their reward.'




