Collect for Sunday 11th June:

Bountiful God, giver of all gifts, who poured your Spirit upon your servant Barnabas and gave him grace to encourage others: help us, by his example, to be generous in our judgements and unselfish in our service; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Readings for Sunday 11th June: Acts 11.19-end

¹⁹ Now those who were scattered because of the persecution that took place over Stephen travelled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Antioch, and they spoke the word to no one except Jews. ²⁰But among them were some men of Cyprus and Cyrene who, on coming to Antioch, spoke to the Hellenists* also, proclaiming the Lord Jesus.

²¹The hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number became believers and turned to the Lord. ²²News of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. ²³When he came and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast devotion; ²⁴for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord. ²⁵Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, ²⁶ and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for an entire year they associated with* the church and taught a great many people, and it was in Antioch that the disciples were first called 'Christians'. ²⁷ At that time prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. ²⁸One of them named Agabus stood up and predicted by the Spirit that there would be a severe famine over all the world: and this took place during the reign of Claudius. ²⁹The disciples determined that according to their ability, each would send relief to the believers* living in Judea; 30this they did, sending it to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

John 15.12-17

¹² 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵I do not call you servants* any longer, because the servant* does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. ¹⁶You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. ¹⁷I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Almighty God, who on the day of Pentecost sent your Holy Spirit to the apostles with the wind from heaven and in tongues of flame, filling them with joy and boldness to preach the gospel: by the power of the same Spirit strengthen us to witness to your truth and to draw everyone to the fire of your love; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Special Appeal

Did you know that of the food distributed in emergency parcels by The Olive Branch, 90% is donated directly as food items? This amounts to several tons of food in the course of a year – an astonishing testimony to the generosity of people in and around Lancaster. There is often a dip in food donations in the summer, but this year the dip is earlier and much more marked. We are seeing many empty shelves and are therefore making a special appeal this month.

Could you consider donating one or two items in the coming weeks, either regularly or as a one-off? There are food collection points at St Paul's Scotforth Road and at Hala. Or perhaps you could set up your own collection point at home, to enable friends and neighbours to donate as well.

We appreciate every food item donated, with a particular request for tinned meat, pasta, pasta sauce and tinned fruit or vegetables.

The remaining 10% of food is mostly bought in, usually as fresh essentials like bread and milk. So, we are always glad to accept financial donations as well as food items, and giftaid can make donations go even further. These also help to pay our small staff team, who manage operations and support our wonderful volunteers.
