# Readings for Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> September: Psalm145

- I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name for ever and ever.
- <sup>2</sup> Every day I will bless you, and praise your name for ever and ever.
- <sup>3</sup> Great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised, and his greatness is unsearchable.
- <sup>4</sup> One generation shall laud your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.
- <sup>5</sup> On the glorious splendour of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate.
- <sup>6</sup> The might of your awesome deeds shall be proclaimed, and I will declare your greatness.
- <sup>7</sup>They shall celebrate the fame of your abundant goodness, and shall sing aloud of your righteousness.
- <sup>8</sup>The LORD is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.
- <sup>9</sup>The LORD is good to all, and his compassion is over all that he has made.
- <sup>10</sup> All your works shall give thanks to you, O LORD, and all your faithful shall bless you!
- 11 They shall speak of the glory of your kingdom,

- and tell of your power,
- <sup>12</sup> to make known to all people your mighty deeds, and the glorious splendour of your kingdom.
- <sup>13</sup> Your kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and your dominion endures throughout all generations.
- The LORD is faithful in all his words, and gracious in all his deeds.
- <sup>14</sup> The LORD upholds all who are falling, and raises up all who are bowed down.
- <sup>15</sup> The eyes of all look to you, and you give them their food in due season.
- <sup>16</sup> You open your hand, satisfying the desire of every living thing.
- <sup>17</sup> The LORD is just in all his ways, and kind in all his doings.
- <sup>18</sup> The LORD is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth.
- <sup>19</sup> He fulfils the desire of all who fear him; he also hears their cry, and saves them.
- <sup>20</sup> The LORD watches over all who love him; but all the wicked he will destroy.
- <sup>21</sup> My mouth will speak the praise of the LORD, and all flesh bless his holy name for ever and ever.

#### Matthew 20.1-16

20'For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire labourers for his vineyard. <sup>2</sup>After agreeing with the labourers for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. <sup>3</sup>When he went out about nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle in the market-place; <sup>4</sup>and he said to them, "You also go into the vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right." So they went. <sup>5</sup>When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same. <sup>6</sup>And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, "Why are you standing here idle all day?" <sup>7</sup>

They said to him, "Because no one has hired us." He said to them, "You also go into the vineyard." <sup>8</sup>When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, "Call the labourers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and then going to the first." <sup>9</sup>When those hired about five o'clock came, each of them received the usual daily wage. <sup>10</sup>Now when the first came, they thought they would receive more; but each of them also received the usual

daily wage. <sup>11</sup>And when they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, <sup>12</sup>saying, "These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat." <sup>13</sup>But he replied to one of them, "Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? <sup>14</sup>Take what belongs to you and go; I choose to give to this last the same as I give to you. <sup>15</sup>Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?" <sup>16</sup>So the last will be first, and the first will be last.'

# **SLCT Songs of Praise**



Last Sunday afternoon Fr David Branford welcomed to St Bernadette's about sixty members from different churches who made a cheerful sound singing familiar hymns to celebrate twenty five years of South Lancaster Churches Together. At the beginning of the service our Lancaster MP, Cat

Smith, who is a member of Lancaster Methodist Church, presented Rev. Irene John with a copy of an Early Day Motion which she had tabled in Parliament congratulating 'all the churches that have come together over the past

25 years in the spirit of ecumenicalism .... to serve and pray for the communities across South Lancaster and beyond.'



Bible readings and prayers interspersed the hymns and we were also reminded of many of the group's activities, which included services during Advent and Lent, and for Ascension Day in St Martin's College chapel. An ecumenical choir had been formed to sing Garth Hewitt's 'Feast of Life' and Advent Carol services led by the choir continued from thereon. Prayer Walks during which we pray for people, the environment and public services took place during the summer, and SLCT joined Lancashire Sings Christmas in December.

Christian Aid quizzes were good social fund-raising evenings.

Changes in which churches played a leading role during the past 25 years were noted, some positive such as the growth of Fairtrade, campaigns to cancel the debts of poor countries, human rights and an increase in activity to protect the environment. However housing problems, fuel poverty and the need for foodbanks were reminders that the churches need to adapt to changing times. Most of the congregation stayed on for refreshments after the service and memories of people and activities were shared over coffee and cakes. It was a joyous, festive afternoon praising and thanking God for his many blessings.
