Almighty Father, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of all: govern the hearts and minds of those in authority, and bring the families of the nations, divided and torn apart by the ravages of sin, to be subject to his just and gentle rule; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Readings for Sunday 12th November:

Psalm 23

¹The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. ²He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; ³he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake. ⁴Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff they comfort me. ⁵You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. ⁶Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long.

1 Thessalonians 4.13-end

¹³ But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. ¹⁴For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. ¹⁵For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. ¹⁶For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord for ever. ¹⁸Therefore encourage one another with these words.

Memories of Valerie Fox – Funeral - Friday 3rd November 2023

Valerie was born on 21st June 1930 in Dunstable. She had a brother Victor and a sister Lynn. Valerie married David Fox in 1957 and they both trained as social workers. They moved to various places for David's work, and bought their house in Scotforth when he was stationed at Morecambe. Valerie and David had three children: Helen, Ruth and Jonathan; and eight grandchildren. Valerie cared for several children to help David in his work. She also looked after Jonathon's son Christopher when he was two and three years old.

Valerie was the ideal person to set up St Paul's Church Mother & Baby group in the 1980's – an initiative of the Mothers' Union which provided an opportunity for mothers of new babies to meet up.

In the past St Paul's Social Committee provided various activities in the parish, and Valerie was very involved in organizing all such events, especially the train journeys to towns and cities in the summer months. In addition to all this Valerie was a very able Church Secretary for many years. *Kathleen Walker*

Christmas Greetings:




