Readings for Sunday 25th April:

Acts 8.26-end

²⁶ Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' ³⁰So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' ³¹He replied, 'How can I, unless someone

guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. ³²Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this: 'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before so he does not open his mouth. ³³In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? life is taken away from the earth.' 34The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' 35Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' ³⁸He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. ³⁹When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. 40But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

John 15.1-8

15'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. ²He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. ³You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.

We will keep everyone posted about when this final week will be as we will have to cancel the Thursday morning service that week.

2024 Annual Parish Meeting Report by John Gedge, PCC Secretary:

At the meeting held on 21 April 2024 Jayne Weatherill and Keith Weatherill were elected as Churchwardens. Katherine Froggatt was elected for a second 3-year term on the PCC. Paul Ducklin, Elizabeth Field and Tom Grimwood were elected to the PCC for their first 3-year term. Volunteering Opportunities:

A number of parish roles need to be filled in the next year. Further information for any of the roles is available from the Churchwardens or Rev Rebecca.

<u>Treasurer</u>: The treasurer advises the PCC on budgeting, maintains the financial records and ensures the bills are paid. The church accounts follow the calendar year. Brian has a computer system which simplifies the process of creating the end of year accounts. Brian has announced that he will stand down after completing the accounts for 2024 so there would be time to learn the system or to investigate a new system if this is thought useful.

Independent Examiner: This role involves checking the end of year accounts so it only involves time once a year.

Parish Safeguarding Officer: The parish uses a national system which identifies the training required for each role. The system also issues reminders to ensure all our volunteers' training is up to date. This role involves operating the system, following Safer Recruitment guidance for applications to volunteer positions and investigating any safeguarding issues that arise. There is the opportunity to be a Deputy PSO and shadow the current postholder this year.

Health and Safety Officer: The post holder would ideally have a good understanding of H&S. As we have 3 buildings, which are open to the public, we have to ensure that policies and procedures are all in place, reviewed timely and to ensure audits and workplace inspections are carried out. The post also involves investigating any accidents or near misses. There is the opportunity to work alongside the current H&S Officer during this year.

Data Protection Officer: The post holder's duties involve ensuring our parish records are kept in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulations and to carry out an annual audit. There would also be the need to, with the incumbent, respond to any FOI requests.
