¹⁷So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; ¹⁸for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. ¹⁹So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, ²⁰built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. ²¹In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; ²²in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling-place for God.

Mark 6.30-34, 53-end

³⁰ The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught. ³¹He said to them, 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.' For many were coming and

going, and they had no leisure even to eat. ³²And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. ³³Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. ³⁴As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

⁵³ When they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret and moored the boat. ⁵⁴When they got out of the boat, people at once recognized him, ⁵⁵and rushed about that whole region and began to bring the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was. ⁵⁶And wherever he went, into villages or cities or farms, they laid the sick in the market-places, and begged him that they might touch even the fringe of his cloak; and all who touched it were healed.

SLCT Prayer Walk - an enjoyable evening:

The SLCT Prayer walk took place last Thursday evening (11th July). The weather was kind to us for most of the walk, but it just started to rain as we returned to the Hala centre – so we rushed in and concluded the event in comfort and dryness!

There were 28 walkers – the largest number we have had for our annual walk – mostly from our 4 SLCT churches, but joined by several members of the committee from Lancaster Churches

Together. The walk took us around the local area, stopping every so often to pray for the countryside, residential areas, Universities, care homes, poverty, refugees, volunteers and world-wide problems. All those leading the prayers had willingly agreed to do so – thank you.

It was a good time to meet and talk with members of other churches, especially with anyone we didn't already know – and there were quite a few 'new' faces.

Arton kept us informed about the dates and the history of properties and buildings we walked past; Mandy, a volunteer at the Hala Hearts Hub explained that it was a meeting place and craft club for refugees; and Ian spoke about the Hala Pantry. Margaret led us in a short service of thanksgiving before we shared light refreshments, to end what had been an enjoyable, informative and prayerful evening.

Update on the Church Roof:

As you will be aware from the hazard tape in church last Sunday, we do have some new issues with the church roof.
After meeting with our architect and a builder this week we had to, following their advice, close our church for Sunday morning services this week. We have also

had to, regrettably, cancel the Year 6 leavers service and this is now in school today and arrange for two funeral services to take place in another church with Rev Catherine still taking the services. How can one 'little' hole make such an impact? Well, the whole board is now bowing out and there is a further board that is looking

is now bowing out and there is a further board that is looking somewhat precarious.

What do we do now? Keith and I are working closely with our architect, builders and the Diocesan Advisory Committee. We are waiting to hear what work will be required so that we can move forward and several suggestions have been put forward by our architect and are under discussion.

Do we know the cost and the timescale? Can we still use church? These are all questions that we hope we will be aware of the answers by the end of this week, beginning of next week. Whilst we all love our church building and want to worship inside it the health, safety and well-being of everyone has to be our priority. We are fortunate that we have a lovely parish hall in which to move our services in to. When we have to move into the hall for a longer period of time whilst work is being undertaken then we will be looking for a team of volunteers to help us set up on a Saturday evening – watch out for the appeal.

In the meantime, as soon as we know more then we will include updates in the Parish News and make announcements at services.
