Collect for Sunday 10th August:

Lord God, your Son left the riches of heaven and became poor for our sake: when we prosper save us from pride, when we are needy save us from despair, that we may trust in you alone; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Readings for Sunday 10th August: Hebrews 11.1-3, 8-16

11 Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ²Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. ³By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

⁸ By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. ¹¹By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. ¹²Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, 'as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.' 13 All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, 14for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. 15 If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

Luke 12.32-40

³² 'Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. ³³Sell your possessions, and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. ³⁴For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. ³⁵ 'Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; ³⁶be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may

open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks. ³⁷Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them. ³⁸If he comes during the middle of the night, or near dawn, and finds them so, blessed are those slaves.

³⁹ 'But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁰You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.'

Post Communion prayer for Sunday 10th August:

Strengthen for service, Lord, the hands that have taken holy things; may the ears which have heard your word be deaf to clamour and dispute; may the tongues which have sung your praise be free from deceit; may the eyes which have seen the tokens of your love shine with the light of hope; and may the bodies which have been fed with your body be refreshed with the fullness of your life; glory to you for ever.



You can do something for the People of Palestine

We see the deaths and devastation on our screens and feel helpless, but we could give support through our MP. Cat Smith is running the Great Scottish Run (half marathon in Glasgow) on 5 October. Cat writes:

'As some of you know, I've been deeply moved and distressed by the ongoing humanitarian crisis in Gaza. I've raised these issues in Parliament, spoken out for the people of Palestine, for the recognition of the Palestinian state, and called for immediate aid and justice. But like so many, I've felt the need to do something more — something tangible. So I'm running this half marathon to raise funds for Medical Aid for Palestinians (MAP) — an incredible organisation providing life-saving healthcare, emergency medical supplies, and essential support in Gaza and across Palestine. I've run these kinds of races before, but this one feels different. I'll be carrying with me the stories and suffering of those I've heard from — and I'll be running in solidarity with them.'

'If you are able to support my run by donating to MAP, I'd be incredibly grateful. Every pound makes a real difference.'

School Admission and 'Green Card' System and change to signing:

We would like to remind parents about the 'green card' system that we operate at St Paul's, both in church and at our Hala Worship Centre. At the present time attendance for either primary or secondary school admissions is for "parent and/or child". This means if you attend a service without your child you should still get your card signed.

If your child attends with another family member, e.g. grandparent, then the green card can be signed for your child's attendance however, if they attend without your child the card cannot be signed – your child has to be with them.

We would like to remind parents that when we sign supplementary forms (primary or secondary) either in-person or after being contacted by a school; we will need to see the green card to ratify and inform the completion of the requests.

We have been reminded in recent weeks the importance of parents understanding and reading the admission policy of the school chosen – it is not the responsibility of the church to ensure your understanding. We can only complete the information requested by the school following their guidance. If you have any queries about a specific school admission policy then you should contact the school directly.

Change moving forward:

Please note that the green cards will only be signed at the <u>end</u> of the service you are attending and must be signed by either a member of clergy or lay minister leading the service, churchwarden (Jayne or Keith) or Assistant Churchwarden (Phil, Jon, Dave or Michelle). 
